## **Prohibited Firearms in the State of Illinois**

In accordance with ILCS 5/24-3, Section A, Subsection (h), C.O.P.S, Inc. may not sell, or deliver to an unlicensed individual any <u>handgun</u> having a barrel, slide, frame or receiver which is a <u>die casting of zinc alloy or other non-homogeneous</u> <u>metal</u> that melts or deforms at a temperature of less than 800 degrees Fahrenheit.

This restriction currently covers many popular and inexpensive handguns including, but not limited to, the following:

If you already own a firearm covered by this law, you may continue to own, shoot, and sell it privately to another non-licensed individual.
